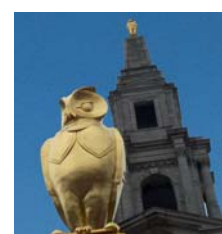

Every Owl Matters – A Cultural Heritage project aimed at KS1 and KS2 pupils



ArtForms, working in partnership with Leeds Owl Trail, are delighted to offer the ‘Every Owl Matters’ project to 10 primary schools.

The ‘Every Owl Matters’ project was developed by the Leeds Owl Trail team as a way of inspiring and connecting children and young people with Leeds’ rich heritage and public art. The project includes a creative workshop delivered in school and a trip to the city centre where the children visit the art gallery and go on the Leeds Owl Trail.

This creative, cultural heritage project will:

- ✓ engage the children in an “owltastic” creative programme
- ✓ extend learning beyond the classroom in an exciting and stimulating way
- ✓ support teachers to deliver the project with other classes in school

Project Aim:

- To deepen children’s awareness and understanding of Leeds as a multicultural city with a rich cultural heritage.

Objectives:

- To use the Leeds Coat of Arms and the Owl motif as a starting point for a creative exploration of and investigation into the city’s heritage.
- To use the Owl Trail to explore the history of the city through it’s architecture, public art and stories of people and places.
- To create artworks which respond to the theme of the Leeds Coat of Arms and Owls which can be displayed in school, contributing to the learning environment.
- To develop pupils emotional and descriptive skills through the making of individual 2D and 3D artworks.
- To develop speaking and listening skills by encouraging children to reflect on and discuss their own artwork in relation to others work (both peer and professional artists work).

Curriculum Links: History, Citizenship, Geography, Art & Design, PSHCE.

There are two programmes available:

Programme A will include:

- A 2 hour twilight planning and briefing session for 2 teachers from each participating school.
- A half day creative workshop in school exploring the Leeds Coat of Arms and the Owl motif.
- A full day trip to Leeds City Centre including:
 - ★ A visual art workshop based at the City Art Gallery. Children will make their own owls inspired by the gallery's collection of artworks.
 - ★ The children will be taken on the Owl Trail led by the Owl Trail Tour Guide (Actor in role from the Theatre Co. Blah Blah Blah)
- A scheme of work for teachers.

Subsidised COST: £790

Programme B will include:

- A 2 hour twilight planning and briefing session for 2 teachers from each participating school.
- A full day trip to Leeds City Centre including:
 - ★ A visual art workshop based at the City Art Gallery. Children will make their own owls inspired by the gallery's collection of artworks.
 - ★ The children will be taken on the Owl Trail led by the Owl Trail Tour Guide (Actor in role from the Theatre Co. Blah Blah Blah)
- A scheme of work for teachers.
